

If you are a tenant facing eviction, here are 6 key things to remember about your rights

1

You CANNOT be evicted unless a judge orders you to leave.

2

If your landlord gives you an eviction letter or tells you to leave, you DO NOT HAVE TO LEAVE unless a judge orders it. You have the right to a court hearing.

3

It is illegal for a landlord to change your locks or turn off your water to force you out without the permission of a judge. For more information about illegal evictions, visit: rb.gy/vvkvgo.
